A professional conflict resolution counselor for churches and international missions, Javier Leon, went with us in February to help us devise the best way to peacefully move forward with THEA's work alongside our brothers and sisters in LaVictoire. Sadly, those who seem to be affected most by the conflicts in the church and community are the children.

God bless Acadia from Rochester, NY who donated stuffed animals! We needed to teach the children to emotionally connect with the stuffed animals- that they could give and receive love from them. The children in the children's home who seem so lost need to know God's love, peace, and joy. Let's continue to pray for the children and the church in Lavictoire.

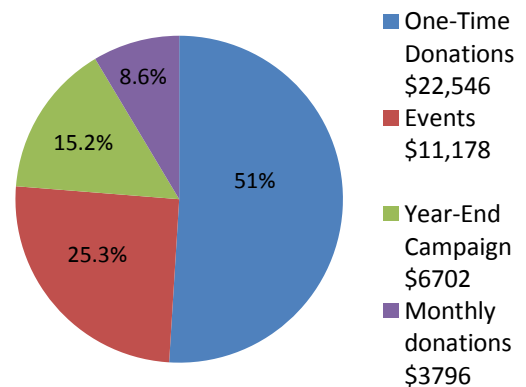
Establishment of Rehabilitation Department

- August 1st, THEA-sponsored rehabilitation student, Wilnot Exantus, was hired at Comite Bienfaisance de Pignon to pioneer their new rehabilitation department
- On the July trip, Cynthia, Amy, Wilnot, Gerome and Willey (translators)...
 - 1) Cleaned and stocked the new department
 - 2) Created and translated 5 necessary administrative and clinical forms
 - 3) Met with the doctors and nurses at the hospital to introduce, answer questions, and collaborate further
- Wilnot provides therapy for 50 patients per month.

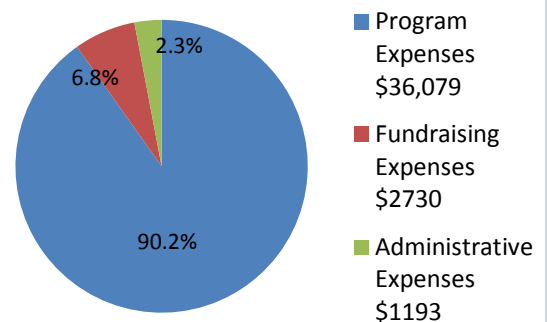
THEA's Mission
